Idaho Assessment Centers

Assessment Centers aim to prevent and divert youth from juvenile justice and child welfare systems through a single point of contact. This occurs by means of intervention in schools, at point of or after arrest, at the request of parents/caregivers, or through partnerships with other community stakeholders. Leveraging validated screening and assessment tools, Centers work to understand the barriers youth and families are experiencing at home, school, or in the community. Following assessment, Centers partner with the youth and family to access individualized resources and services to help overcome barriers and create a stable environment. Idaho's Assessment Centers have been recognized locally and nationally for the impact they've had on youth.
